




2015 ANHC REVENUE

## 2015 PATIENTS BY PAYOR SOURCE


Self Pay/Uninsured	36%

## 2015 PATIENTS BY INCOME


100% and below	67%

(as percentage of federal poverty level)




## 2015 PATIENT DIVERSITY

One or more races	11%




## 2015 PATIENTS BY AGE
